OBJECTIVES

Since 1999 the International Summer School "Infectious Disease Epidemiology" is a well established certified curriculum for higher qualification in infectiousdisease epidemiology and has attracted several hundred microbiologists, public health experts, studentsand IDE specialists from European and non-European countries. Each year the topics are adapted to the actual situation, focussing this year the challenges for Public Health in megacities and vulnerable populations, and epidemics of norovirus, measles and chicungunya.

The courses are taught by experienced lecturers from Germany and other European Countries, facilitating discussion and networking across geographical and disciplinary boundaries.

At the end of the IDE course the participant will have a profound understanding of the special IDE concepts and methods. He/she will be enabled to manage an outbreak, to correctly create and interpret surveillance data, and to use simple mathematical models for the spread of IDs as well as to use basic health economic evaluations. In addition he/she will know how to apply the learned concepts and methods to actual global public health challenges (e.g. avian influenza, tuberculosis, norovirus)

TEACHING METHODS

Teaching methods comprise lectures, seminars and practical learning sessions in small groups.

LANGUAGE

Teaching language will be English.

CERTIFICATE

All participants who successfully complete the programme will be awarded a certificate issued by the School of Public Health, University of Bielefeld, to be used for further qualification in infectious diseases, epidemiology or public health. In addition a certificate for 3 ECTS points can be issued. The IDE programme is certified by the Ärztekammer Westfalen-Lippe for continuing education.
